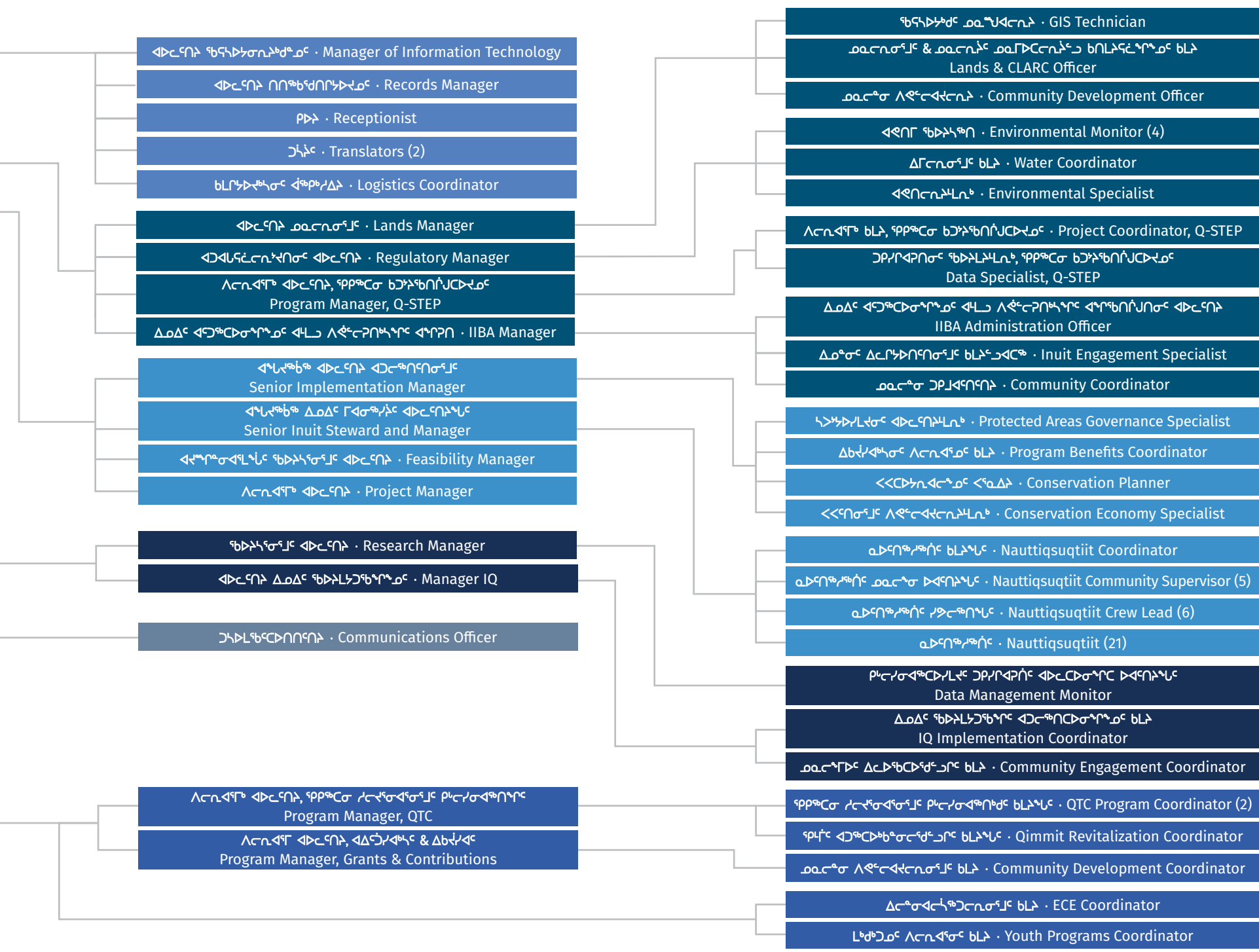

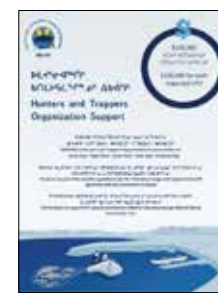

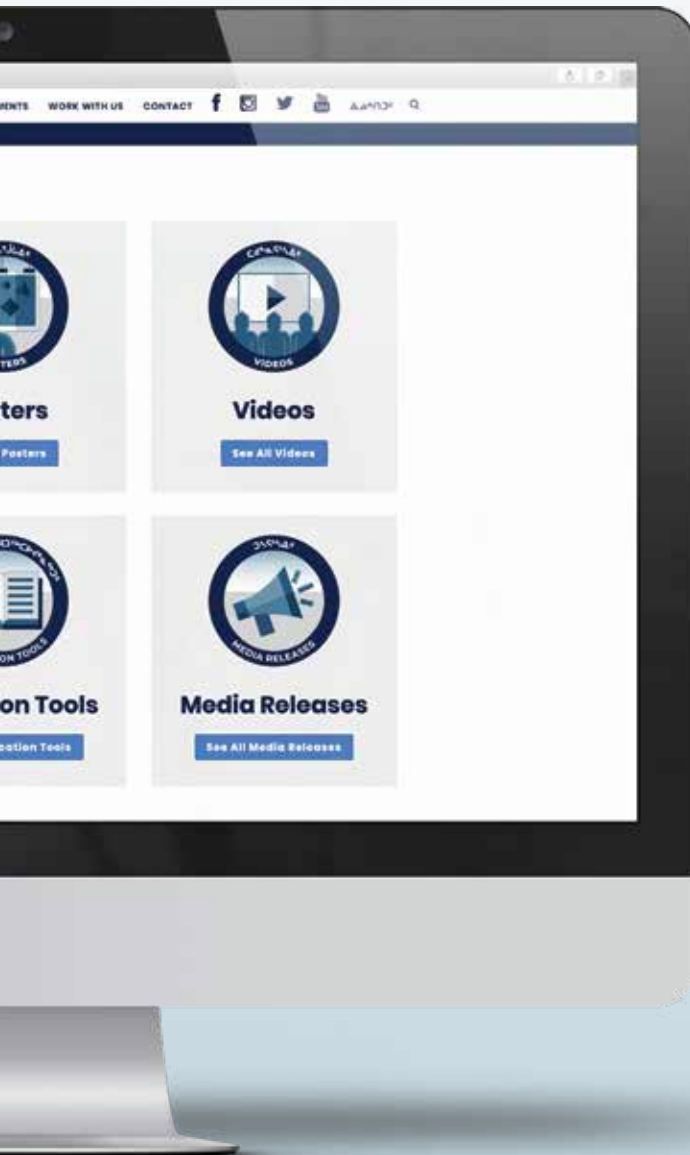

QIA RESPONSE TO COVID-19



In mid-March QIA implemented new measures in response to COVID-19 and suspended all regular programs and closed our offices to the public. Our staff's efforts were re-directed to design new emergency initiatives. On March 30, QIA rolled out two initiatives to assist Qikiqtani Inuit during the COVID-19 pandemic including food vouchers for Elders and emergency funding for Qikiqtani families to social distance on-the-land and harvest.

The funds for QIA's COVID-19 response plan came from the Indigenous Community Support Fund (ICSF) announced by the Federal Government on March 25, 2020. QIA's share of that fund is approximately \$6.1 million (\$6,132,544).

These initiatives have been a huge success. Our online applications for the on-the-land program were completed quickly. Families expressed their gratitude and sent photos and messages from successful on-the-land trips from across the Qikiqtani Region. Elders have told us that the grocery vouchers made a big difference in their lives – giving them regular access to necessary household goods.

COVID-19 has greatly impacted how we conduct ourselves, at work and at home. We are acclimatizing to the new normal and are finding alternative ways to deliver our programming while respecting social distancing and public health measures.

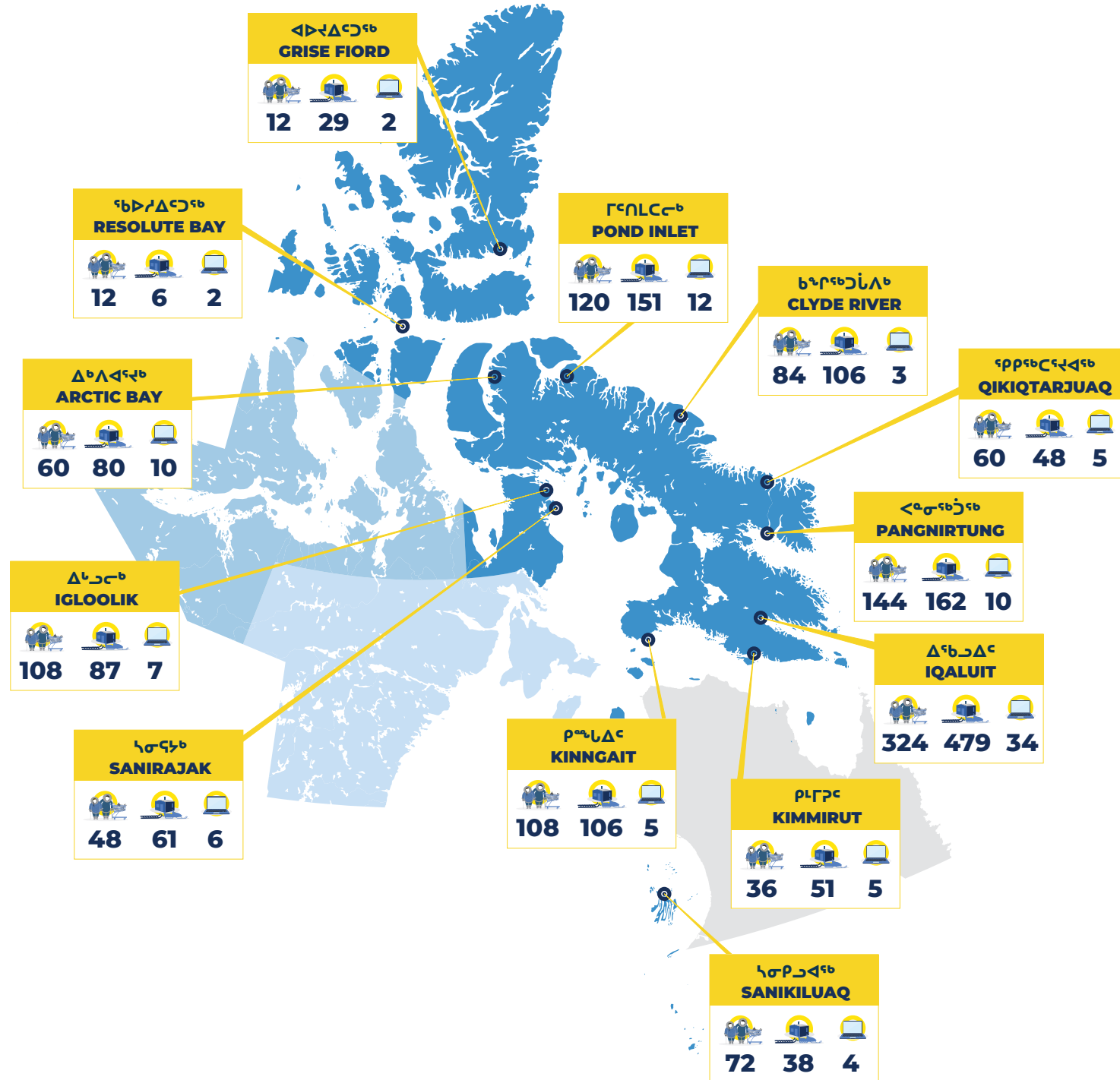

To support social distancing and promote harvesting to provide healthy country food to our communities, QIA offered Qikiqtani Inuit with established camps or cabins short-term financial assistance to go out on-the-land.

A one-time grant of \$1,500 was available to every Qikiqtani household. This program ran from April 3 to June 30, 2020. The money for this program comes from the Federal Government's Indigenous Community Support Fund (ISCF).

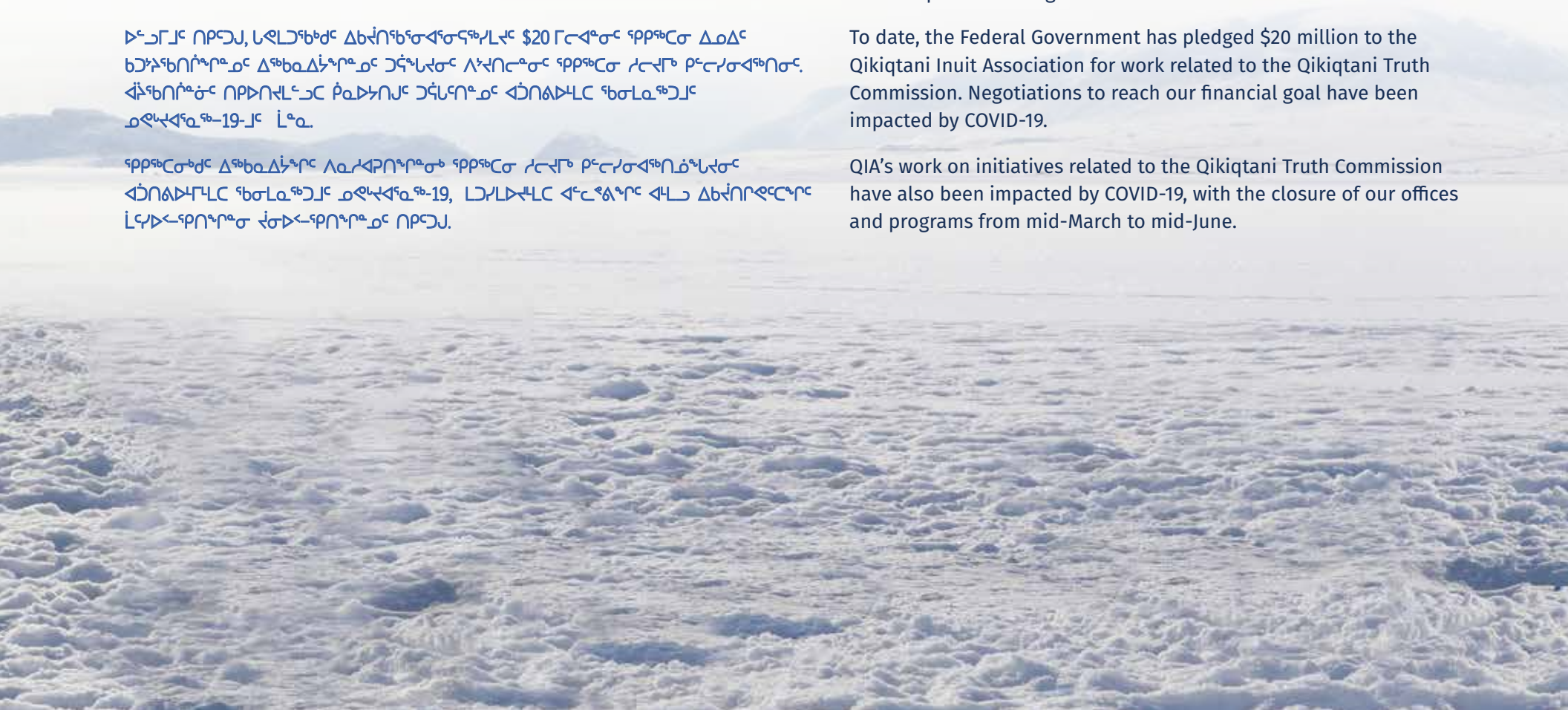

On August 14, 2019, the Government of Canada formally acknowledged and apologized for modern-day colonial practices imposed on Inuit in the Qikiqtani Region between 1950 and 1975, such as forced relocations, family separation, and killing of qimmiit.

Along with this apology was a signing of a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) and a promise of a renewed partnership towards positive change.

To date, the Federal Government has pledged \$20 million to the Qikiqtani Inuit Association for work related to the Qikiqtani Truth Commission. Negotiations to reach our financial goal have been impacted by COVID-19.

QIA’s work on initiatives related to the Qikiqtani Truth Commission have also been impacted by COVID-19, with the closure of our offices and programs from mid-March to mid-June.

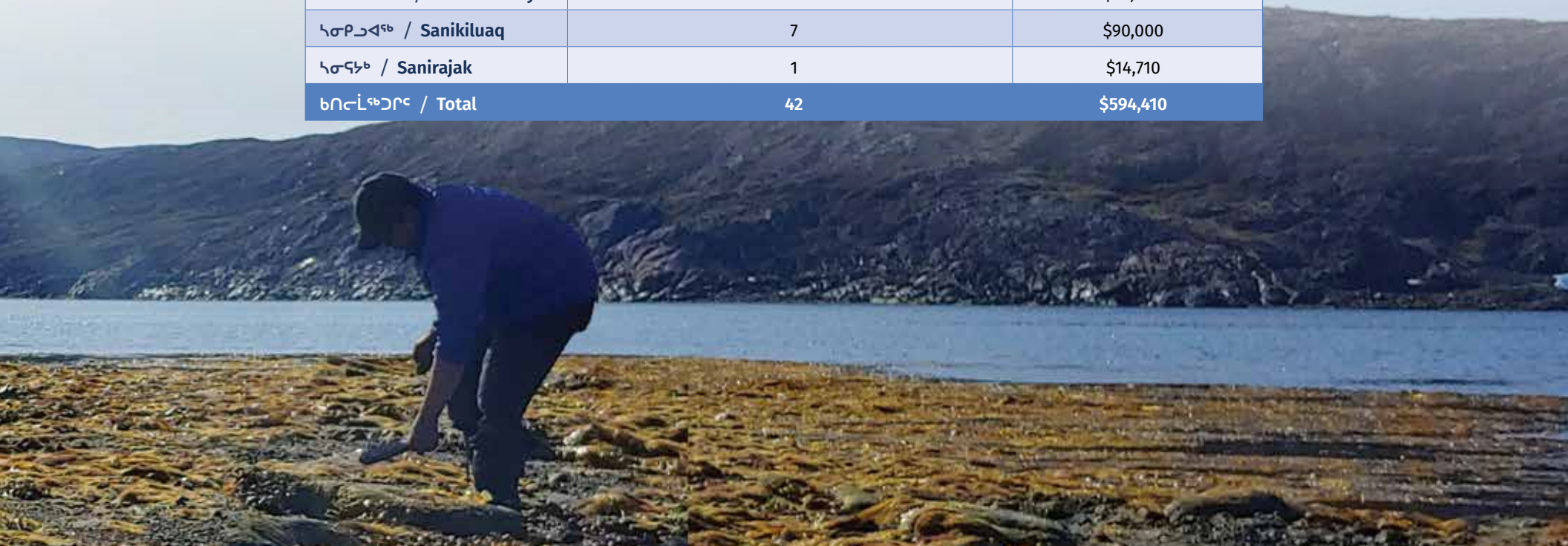

On March 11 the World Health Organization announced that COVID-19 was a global pandemic.

Kakivak's first priority was assisting clients. During the following weeks we quickly took action to support the individuals, businesses and organizations that depended on Kakivak for financial support. Our first responses included:

- Advancing funds for daycare centers up to the end of September
- Notifying students that they would still receive their approved funding for living expenses, even if their classes were cancelled
- Providing initial relief to businesses by postponing loan payments
- Adjusting our management systems so that payments could be made by electronic funds transfers rather than by cheque

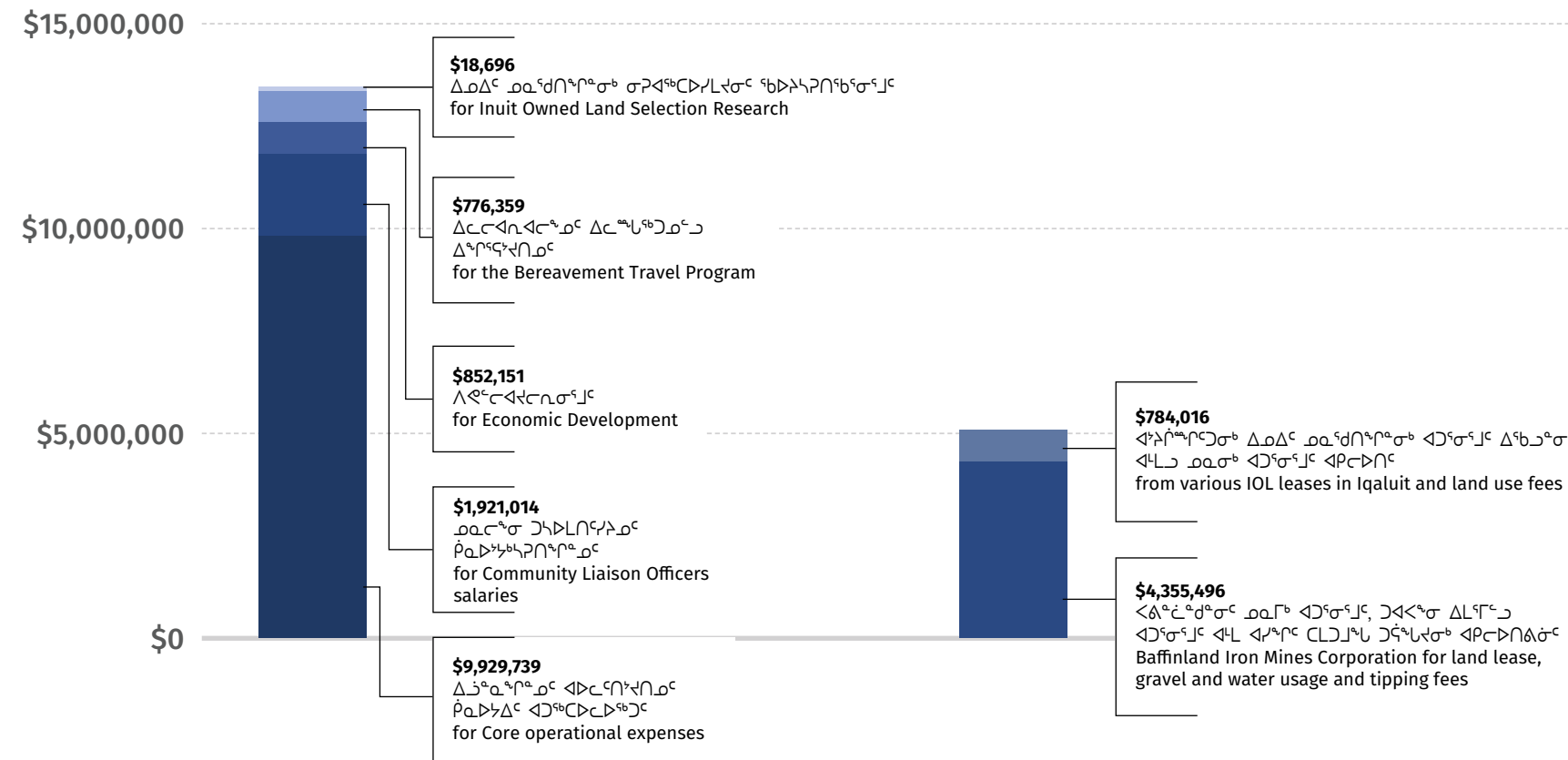

Soon afterwards Kakivak and QIA began working together to develop and launch two new COVID-19 relief programs. The Qikiqtani COVID-19 Business Relief Program was launched to provide direct support for small Inuit-owned businesses that were forced to close or had significant reductions in revenue due to the pandemic, and the Qikiqtani COVID-19 Wage Subsidy and Training Program was launched to help employers keep Inuit employed. By summer 2020 over \$500,000 had been provided under these COVID-19 relief programs.

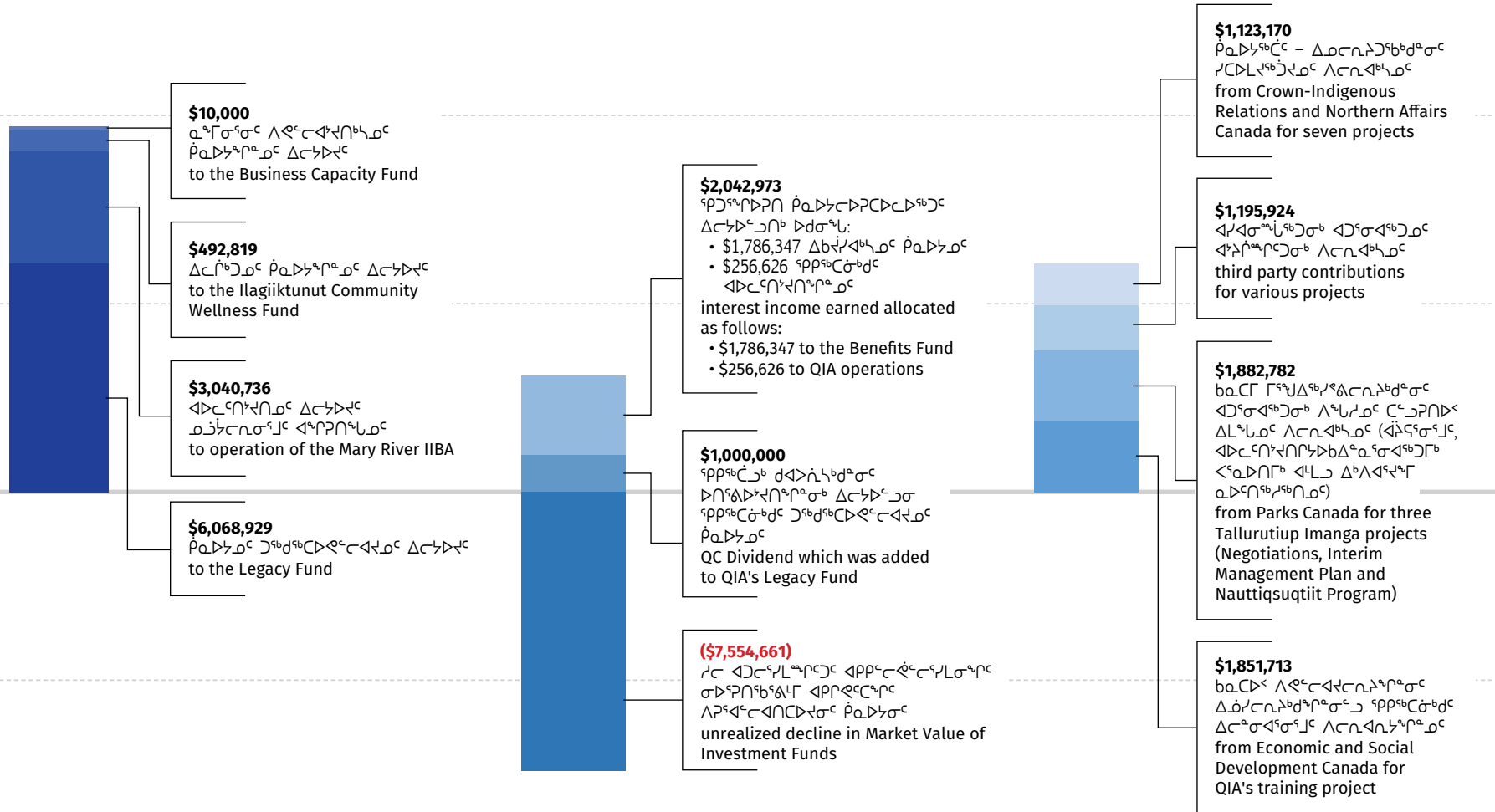
