If you experienced a harvesting-related loss that was caused by the Mary River Project you may be eligible for compensation pursuant to the Mary River Project IIBA. This Claim Form is used to initiate the claim process for individuals. Please read the *Applicant Guidelines for Individuals* available on the QIA website before filling out a claim.
